An approach to practice Julia Barfield

Founding director of Marks Barfield Architects (MBA) together with husband and partner David Marks - also the originators and creative entrepreneurs behind the design and realisation of the London Eye.

Julia Barfield will talk about the ideas, design process and construction stories behind some of **Marks Barfield Architects' diverse and bespoke projects**, such as the Kew Treetop Walkway at Kew Gardens and the recently completed University of Cambridge Primary School, the UK's first green Mosque in Cambridge – just started on site and a public realm improvement project in Clapham Old Town.

She will explain what led MBA to become the **architect-entrepreneurs behind the London Eye** and **Brighton's new vertical pier, the i360**, as well as other less well known self-generated projects. Julia will also tell her story from student to private practice and some of her personal experience of the **changing role of the architect**.
